MCFB Women's Committe Recipe Baked Jalapeno Cheese Grits

- 1 (32 oz) can of chicken broth
- 1³/₄ C quick cooking grits, uncooked
- $\frac{1}{2}$ C butter
- 1 medium onion, chopped
- 2 jalapeno peppers, seeded and diced
- 1 large red pepper, chopped
- 2 garlic cloves, pressed
- 2 C shredded sharp cheddar cheese • 2 C shredded Monterey jack cheese
- 5 large eggs, lightly beaten
- $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. salt

Bring broth to a boil stir in grits, reduce heat, and simmer, stirring occasionally, 5 minutes. Cover and remove from heat.

Melt butter in a large skillet; add chopped onion and next 3 ingredients, and sauté 5 minutes or until tender. Stir in grits, cheddar cheese and remaining ingredients. Pour in a lightly greased 9x13 baking dish.

Bake, covered at 350 degrees for 45 minutes or unitl set; server immediately.

For-Most Cattle Chute

Cattle Chute rental fees: \$50.00/day or \$75.00 for 2 consecutive days

Chute sides are 30" wide at the top and taper in with 6 different adjustments from 22" wide to 9" ensuring any size animal will be held securely yet comfortably centered in the headgate.


